In our teaching methods we have always used Mini-Bridge as an introduction for one lesson, but now we are extending its use for several lessons to teach the mechanics of Contract Bridge, declarer play and defence, scoring, and general hand assessment skills, before launching into the complexities of the bidding.

Thank you very much to our Club Members Margaret Bills, Drazel Pincus and Elizabeth Downer who have helped out with Mini bridge classes making sure that table numbers are even for the new players and generally helping out where needed.

As always I rely on the continued support of our long term members to make sure that our new players are treated with respect and encouraged to enjoy their experience at your table.
